BACUP, WITH NEW CHURCH &C
IN ROSSENDALE

The road from Todmorden to Bacup, which is of the most romantic description, winds between tremendous hills, forming precipices of very dangerous appearance. The scenery is occasionally enlivened by naturally cascades falling amidst large and terrifying rocks, which overhang the road.

In the house of Mr James Maden, Greens, near Bacup, resides a female of the name of Mary Harrison, who is now (May 14th, 1818) in her 108th year, born the 25th of July, at Chatham in Cliviger, near Burnley. She remembers the rebellion in 1715. In 1817 she was able to sing an old Christmas carol, of six verses, with much sprightliness and correctness, both in the air and words. Until about April 1818, she was enabled to perform a variety of household work. A daughter of this remarkable female, died of old age when 75. The old lady has seen the fifth generation, and on arriving at her hundredth year assisted in making hay. She has been a domestic, and in the family of the above gentleman and his ancestors, during the greatest part of her life.

There is one church, (or chapel of ease) St John's, under the establishment, Rev William Porter, minister; a Baptist chapel, Rev F. W. Dyer, minister; and a Methodist chapel.

The river Irwell has its rise in Deerplay Hill, near Bacup.

FAIRS: Bacup Club Fair first Thursday in June, and another in March - *New Church*, 29th of April, and 30th of September - *Booth* 3rd February for cattle, Witsun even and Saturday before 23rd October, pedlery.
